Join Peggy Jones for her lecture on racial equality and non-violence.

Peggy Jones is currently an Assistant Professor, Graduate Faculty Member, and past Interim Chairperson of the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO)



Black Studies Department. She is also a Senior Research Fellow and the College of Arts and Science Representative for the Center for Collaboration Science. She co-authored article for publication titled "Toward Achieving the *Beloved Community*: Lessons for Applied Business Research and Practice from the Teachings of Martin Luther King, Jr." She recently developed the Special Topics course at UNO "Gandhi, King, and Nonviolence." Not merely the absence of violence, nonviolence is a proactive program for positive change and transformation. In her presentation, Prof. Jones will share facts about the historical figures Martin Luther King, Jr. and Mohandas K. Gandhi and how these two political and spiritual leaders employed nonviolent tactics to achieve their socio-political goals. She will also discuss the social construction of nonviolence as a workable alternative for conflict resolution.
