

Riverfront Revitalization

Community leaders from Omaha and Council Bluffs are working together with government officials and stakeholders to improve both sides of the Missouri River. This work will define an achievable vision that attracts residents, businesses and visitors to the area while supporting growth and enhancing connectivity. A national team of experts, led by OJB Landscape Architecture, has developed a master plan for areas near and around the riverfront. The public was invited to learn about the Council Bluffs side of the project at a community meeting held on Wednesday, May 30 at the Council Bluffs Community Hall. Police Department Headquarters

Progress is happening at the new CBPD headquarters building. The project is currently \$2.4 million under the \$20 million bond. “We’ve worked hard with our partners from Hoefer Wysocki Architects, Sampson Construction, and Project Advocates to properly invest the bond dollars with which we’ve been trusted. We are looking forward to having the critical equipment and other resources we need to better serve the community,” said Police Chief, Tim Carmody. The headquarters is expected to be complete and fully operational by December 2018.

East Beltway Project Update

After waiting nearly ten years, the first segment of the East Beltway is under construction and is expected to be completed and open to traffic this summer. It includes the extension of Eastern Hills Drive from Cedarbrook Drive to just north of Cedar Lane and the reconstruction of approximately 900 feet of Cedar Lane, west of Eastern Hills Drive. This segment of new roadway connects the gap along Eastern Hills Drive between US Highway 6 and State Orchard Road. Future phases of the East Beltway will improve the transportation network in eastern Council Bluffs by linking US Highway 6 to Iowa Highway 92. The East Beltway also provides improved connections to developments along Greenview Road, Steven Road, and Cottonwood Road. The continuity for the local transportation system will support future land development, increases the capacity of existing roads to accommodate traffic demands, and improves emergency access.
